

Said Mary from further Examination of the said Controversy and holding  
therein did cause the said William to sue and whereas afterwards  
upon Revival of the said Difference in the said County Court by the said  
Mary against the said Joan, the said William having been Justice of  
Peace as aforesaid and thereby as aforesaid apprised of the said Matter or  
Cause was obliged and did go into the said County Court and there  
Impartially declare and upon Oath & Oath of manner and form, truth  
and Certainty, of the final determination and agreement of the said differ-  
ence before him in manner above recited. and did thereby Justly overthrow  
all proceedings therein the Equity and Justice of the Law not admitting of two  
Satisfactions for one of the same Debt or Damage. Yet the aforesaid Mary being  
not Ignorant of the Integrity & Singular Justice of him the said William in  
of the premises and Transactions above said but out of her meer and evil  
malice for and private hatred evil disposition and Implacable Envious  
Spirit, Publick Contumacious and Revenge Desiring to hurt deface dishonour  
Blasphemy and utterly to destroy the good name fame, Estimation, Credit & Dignity  
of him the said William and to bring him into contempt trouble vexation  
Scandal utter infamy and Disgrace and to render him as a partial Admi-  
nistrator of Justice and Sponsor of causes did openly and publicly in the  
presence and hearing of James Hucks one of the Inhabitants of  
this County and divers other of her Maj<sup>ty</sup>s Lige people & all times  
afterwards at Kent County aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court  
viz in this present year of our Lord 1707 saying and uttering words  
to wit and pronouncing divers false and scandalous words against the  
said William to wit and particularly these following upon a some-  
times mention about the said Action tryd in the said County Court of Guil-  
ford: If it had not been for Jott's swearing of said William to wit  
labouring a false Oath meaning that he was perjured I had not lost my  
cause meaning the said cause or Action against the said Joan in the County  
Court of Guil. By reason of the saying and pronouncing of w<sup>ch</sup> said  
false and scandalous words, and many others to the same effect or  
for to say more plain positive and scandalous the same William  
Jott in his good name fame Credit Dignity and Estimation, and also  
in his Impartiality and Integrity in a due Adm<sup>n</sup> of Justice which  
thereunto Required and duly Commissioned is exceedingly hurt and  
suspected and therein damaged and hurt as well amongst the  
Vulgar and Inferior Subjects of her said Maj<sup>ty</sup> as other her  
Maj<sup>ty</sup>s Officers in this County and Towns and many other  
Gentlemen and Faithful Lige people with whom he the said  
William
