Therefore it is Considered by the ^{Co^{rt}} here on the twenty third day of March in the yeare afo^r that the Said Samuel Goodin as to the Said Indictment goe thereof without day paying his Fees Amounting to the Sum of Seven hundred forty and five pounds of Tobacco

And the Said Samuel Goodin comes into Court and Acknowledgeth himselfe Justly indebted unto our Sovereigne Lady Queen Anne her heires & Successors in the full Just Sum of seven pounds Sterling to be leaved upon his Lands & Teniments goods & Chattels conditioned he make not his personall appearance at the next Court & be of good behaviour to all her Majesties Ledge people in y^e meane while likewise came Isaac Bowles and Robert Paerman his Securities and Acknowledged themselves severally Indebted unto our Said Sovereigne Lady Queen Anne her heires & Successors in the full Just Sum of five pounds Sterling each to be leaved as above said Conditioned as a bond where with they are Contented
