Litt & likewise came Sarah Sigley wife of the Said William Sigley & Acknowledged the Same

Ordered by the Worshipful C^t that if Edward Scott high Sheriff of Said County well now allow and pay unto Richard Edwards of Said County two hundred twenty five pounds of Tobacco for the Said Edwards now Leavy & the Said Sheriff if a Levy of the Same, then in the next Leavy to be allowed of Same againe

Thomas Thackstone wth Mary his wife Acknowledges a deed of Sale to Joseph Hull for one hundred Acres called Sandy Plantation

James Cumble appointed Constable in Room of Thomas Thackstone of South Pass has hundred who is there upon Swau takes all the Oaths according to Act of Assembly &c: C^t of Oath of Constable - -

James Whitelee sworn on her Majesty's behalf as an Evidence and Sent to the grand Jury

Philip Burgin proves an Acc^t against Michael Bellian deceased for the Sum of 64 of Tobacco

Richard Davis proves an Acc^t against Thomas Lee for a Sum of one hundred & ninety pounds of Tobacco

Upon Transcript from Cecil County produced in open C^t about John Iyer Son of Thomas Iyer being then bound to Philip Iyer as for the Same Transcript appears - Ord^d that Sumens Issue for Philip Iyer

Margret Bowles Acknowledges a Conveyance to John Biddle of part of Land lying in Cecil County called Georges Delight one hundred thirty two Acres

M^r John Wellinger one of the Attorneys of this C^t here in C^t produceth a certaine Transcript of a Record in Cecil County C^t between John Iyer for Himself and Charles Quiddley Deft and prays that the Same might be Entered amongst the Records of Said County C^t - Ordered that the Said Transcript from Cecil County C^t be Entered on the Records the which Transcript is as followeth viz

In the Records of Cecil County amongst other things is thus Contained viz
Att a C^t held for Cecil County at the C^t house on Passapas river the Eleventh day of June & continued the Twelfth thirteenth & fourteenth & fifteenth days of Said
