Evidences & allegations on both sides the Court gave them their Charges who with-  
draw to consider on the same and after said time doo againe Returne to the  
Barre and being called over as aforesaid the Defendant and being demanded whether they  
Defend at the barre was guilty or not guilty as the Court Judged Doe sayes the Jury  
say she is not guilty & by Jurys Couche thure foreman also say — Therefore  
It is ORDERED by the Court here in the Twenty third day of June in the Sea-  
venth years of her most Majesties Reigne Anne the Anno Domini 1708 that the said  
Mary Ward as to the said Judgment goe thereof without day she paying her fees  
amounting to the sum of Eight hundred and four pounds of Tobacco

William Harris of this County may Enter into Recognizance w<sup>th</sup> good Security for his  
appearance at the next Ct. & good behaviour in the meane time ORDERED by the  
Court here that the said William Harris Enter into Recognizance w<sup>th</sup> two good Security  
for his appearance at the next Ct. & good behav<sup>r</sup> &c.

And the sd William Harris Coms into Court & Acknowledgeth himselfe Justly  
Indebted unto our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne her heirs & Successors in the full  
Just sum of ten pounds Sterl to be payed upon his goods Chattels Lands & In-  
struments Indebted he make not his personall appearance at the next Ct. & of good  
behav<sup>r</sup> to all her Maj<sup>ties</sup> Liege people in the meane time wherewith he was contented

Likewise came into Court William Pott & Edward Scott of this County his Security  
& Acknowledged themselves Indebted unto our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne her  
heirs & Successors in the full Just sum of five pounds Sterl each to be payed on  
their severall goods Chattels Lands & Inuments In case the said William Harris make  
not his personall app<sup>r</sup> at the next Ct. to be held for said County in the meane time to be  
of good behav<sup>r</sup> to all her Majesties Liege People, wherewith they were contented
