for the Defendant and by Abraham Redgrave their foreman aforesaid whereupon
the said Deft William Conmegg by his atty^r moves the Court for judg
ment on the Verdict aforesaid it is to him granted. Therefore it is consider
ed by the Court here that the said Robert Roberts take nothing by his Writ & Judg
but that for his false plea he and his pledges of prosecuting be in arrears that
the said William Conmegg do recover against the said Robert Roberts the
sum of fifty pounds of Debts for his non suite & also the sum of Ten pound
six pence of Debts cost by the said William Conmegg about his defence
in this behalf repaid & by the Court here of his cost adjudged and that the said
William have there Execution &c

Harris of this County may enter into Recognizance for his appearance at the next
Court & good behaviour in the mean time = ORDERED by the Court here that the
said William Harris enter into Recognizance wth good Surety for his appearance
at the next Court & good behaviour &c

AND the said William Harris comes into Court & Acknowledges himselfe justly
Indebted unto our Sovereign Lady Queen Anne her heirs & Successors in the full
& just sum of fifty pounds Sterl to be Levied upon his goods Chattels Land
& Tenements conditioned he make not his personal appearance at the next Court
of good behaviour to all her Majesty's Judges people and especially to Edward Balthard
in the mean time whereunto he is Committed

Likewise came into Court Nathaniel Hyson and George Smith his Secreter
and Acknowledge themselves justly Indebted unto our Sovereign Lady Queen
Anne her heirs & Successors in the full just sum of Twenty five pounds Sterl
to be Levied on their Sec^r all goods Chattels Land & Tenements for as the said
William Harris make not his personal appearance at the next Court to be held for
and
