Mr Leager Esq. the fourth day of Novemb^r. Instant in the Summe
of twenty pounds Sterling Each to be levayd on there goods &
Chattell's Lands and Tenements to y^e use of His Majesty's. Condi-
tionally that if the afd^r Edward should not appeare at this Court to
answer unto what should be objected ag^t him on the Account of
his feloniously stealing one Mare belonging to a Certain Peter Allaby
af^d. The said Recognizances Each of them are by this Court severally
discharged e^d.

ordered by this Court here that the said Edward Williams ent^r into Recognizance
with two good Surety for his appearance to next Court & Good behav^r.
The said Edward committed unto Custody of the Sheriff of said County untill
he shall give Surety as afd^r.

afterwards Came into Court the same Edward Williams and
acknowledged himselfe Indebted to his Majesty King George his heirs
and Successors in the full and Just Summe of twenty pounds Sterling to
be levayd on his goods and Chattell's Lands and Tenements Condi-
tionally that if he do not make his personall appearance at the next
Court to be held for said County And then and there to answer unto
all such things as shall be objected against him on behalfe of his
Majesty Concerning his feloniously taking a Mare from a Certain
Peter Allaby of this County. and that in the mean time he is to be of
good behavoure to all his Majesty's good people &c. wherewith he
acknowledges himselfe to be therow^t Content.

Likewise Came into Court at the same time John Ellis and
Samuel Parsons and acknowledged themselves indebted to his
Majesty King George his heirs and Successors in the full and Just
Summe of ten pounds Sterling Each to be levayd on there Goods
and Chattell's Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the
af^d Edward Williams doth not make his personall appearance
at
