safe keep so that if he have his Body before y^e Justice of our next County Court to
be held at our Court house in y^e TOWN of Chester in said County on the first
Tuesday in June next to be held unto Thomas Bowne of said County Gent.
one of the attorneys of said County a well of Sum of three hundred pounds
of Tobacco Damages by him the said Thomas recovered against y^e said
Dominick Kenshaw before y^e Justice of our s^d Court on y^e Seventh day of
November last whereof he was Convict as appears upon Record as also the
Sum of Six hundred seventy four pounds of Tobacco cost of Suite as also
together with y^e Sum of fifty Six pounds of Tobacco additional Cost thereof.
