AND now at this Court came the said p^lt. by Francis Cookes his attorney and the said Doft being called James and p^lt by his att^y Gray that the said Doft. may give Special Bayes to of above Action which is granted AND that William Justice of the High Sherriffe of said County keeper of said Christopher in safe Custody until he shall give Special Bayes as aforesaid

After which William Glanville and Simon Wilmer both of said County here in Court Cometh and joyntly and severally they and each of them do acknowledge themselves Special Bayes to the above Action & they and either of them do undertake for the said Christopher Bateman of payment of the Debt & Costs if it shall happen that the said James Smith shall obtaine judgement against the said Christopher Bateman in the said Action of Debt and the said Christopher Bateman of Condemnation shall not suffer nor himselfe to the Custody of the Sherriffe of said County Delaware or that the said William Glanville or Simon Wilmer or either of them the body of the said Christopher shall not render &c.

AND the said Doft by Thomas Jones his att^y appears to the above Action. After which the said Doft comes into Court and saith that he cannot justify the Action as of him the said James Smith nor but that the writing obligatory above mentioned is his Act & Deed and that he oweth unto y^e p^lt. the sum of one Thousand and two pounds of Lawfull money and is willing that judgement should be entered for of same and of thereon carrying to that Execution thereof Cause until the tenth day of November next ensuing to which the Plaintiffe Consents.
