Mr. William Frisby Sheriff of this County Comes into Court and Saith that he will pay to the City thirty Shillings Currant money the fine as for the as^d Timothy Rauter

ordered by this Court here that the said Timothy give Surety to keep the County Clear from all Charge that shall or may accrue on account of the same

Timothy Rauter as^d acknowledges himselfe indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the Summe of Two Thousand pounds of Tobacco to be levoyed on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenem. Conditionally that if he do not keep the County Clear from all Charge that hath or shall accrue on account of his begitting a Child on the body of a Certain Mary Tendall wherewith he acknowledges himselfe to be Content.

As^d comes into Court James Meeks and Cornelius Royan both of this County and acknowledges themselves indebted to his Lordship his heirs & Successors in the Summe of Two Thousand five hundred pounds of Tobacco each to be levoyd on their goods and Chattells Lands and Tenem. Conditionally that if the as^d Timothy Rauter shall keep the County Clear from all Charges that hath or shall accrue on account of him the as^d Timothy begitting a Child on the body of a Certain Mary Tendall as^d wherewith they acknowledges themselves to be therew.
