safe keep so that y. have his body before his said Majesty's Justice  
of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of Chester  
in said County to answer unto William Harcum of said County Taylor of  
a plea that he render to him of full and just sume of foure hundred & fifty  
five pounds of every way well qualified Merchantable leaf Tobacco  
clear from all manner of Trash and ground leaves and old Tobacco in  
Cash to Containe of same of y. value of one pounde Seventeen Shillings  
Six pence Sterling money which he unjustly detains etc. Hereof  
he would faile to. And that he have them and there the said word  
etc.

All which said next Court viz. the Twentieth day of March of  
same year after the day of return of said writ came William Frisby  
Gent High Sheriff of said County and made return thereof in these  
words thereon endorsed as follows by Copi Corpus of Wm. Frisby Esq.  
and a Debt being filed when said writ issued forth and a Copy thereof  
served thereon according to Act of Assembly in such Case made was  
as follows in Kent County of John Ingram late of Kent County Cooper etc.
