money which he unjustly detains &c. And whereupon the said William  
by Thomas Boone his atty Saith that whereas the a<sup>d</sup> John of Kent  
:eth day of July Anno Dom<sup>o</sup> Seventeen hundred and fourteen at y<sup>e</sup>  
Parish of St Paul in Kent County a<sup>d</sup> within y<sup>e</sup> Jurisdiction of this Court  
by his Certain writing obligatory which the said John sealed with his  
Seal and as his deed delivered here into Court brought y<sup>e</sup> date whereof  
is the same day and year a<sup>d</sup> bound and obliged himselfe his heirs  
Executors & Adm<sup>r</sup> to pay or cause to be paid unto y<sup>e</sup> a<sup>d</sup> William  
y<sup>e</sup> a<sup>d</sup> full and just Sume of foure hundred & fifty five pounds of every  
way well qualified Marchantable Leaf Tob Clear from all manner of  
trash and ground leavis & old Tobaco in Cash to Contain y<sup>e</sup> Same of y<sup>e</sup>
