as a<sup>d</sup> brought and that she is willing that Judgment should be  
made for the a<sup>d</sup> Summe of fourteen hundred and twenty three  
pounds of Tobacco and Cost thereon accruing Therefore it is  
considered by the Court here on the same day last mentioned that  
the a<sup>d</sup> p<sup>t</sup> Nathaniel Hyson for the a<sup>d</sup> Summe of fourteen  
hundred and twenty three pounds of Tob<sup>o</sup> and also the same  
two hundred forty eight pounds of Tobacco Cost as the premises  
a<sup>d</sup> have an Execution ag<sup>t</sup> the a<sup>d</sup> Mary Bowles

The p<sup>t</sup> Nathaniel Hyson comes into Court and saith that  
he hath paid in part of the above Summe one thousand  
one hundred forty two pounds of Tobacco doth release the  
above Mary Bowles from the same
