the said Honour Miller doth not make her personall appearance at Court to morrow to answer as aforesaid wherewith they acknowledged themselves contented.

The said Honour prays that she may have Counsel assigned her w. is granted. ordered by the Court here that Francis Cooke one of the Attorneys of this Court be Counsel for the afo Honour Miller —
