the grace of God of Great Brittain France & Ireland Queen  
Defender of the faith &c. To the Sheriff of Kent County greeting well  
Commandy. That you attach any the goods Chattells Rights or Credits of the  
Robert Dunchley late of the City of London Merchant if they shall be found

in your Baylyrick to of value of seven pounds three Shillings and two pence sterling money of Great Brittain  
and Twelve hundred pounds of Tobacco & when y<sup>e</sup> have y<sup>e</sup> same so attached or any part thereof the same  
so attached or any part thereof the same in your Chasty Safe keepe so that y<sup>e</sup> have them before the  
Justice of our most County Court to be holden at our Court house in the Town of Choper in said County on the  
first Tuesday in August next there & there to be condemned according to Act of Assembly to be payd  
of a Certain James Smith unless he the said Robert Dunchley by himselfe or his attorney  
shall appear and shew unto the said James Smith in a place of Shoppes upon the Cape according to Law  
and that by good and Lawfull men of your Baylyrick you make known unto the Justice or Justices in whose  
hands you make y<sup>e</sup> same Attachment that he shall or they be and appear before the Justice of our said  
Court to be holden as aforesaid cause if any he shall or they have why the same Goods Chattells  
Rights or Credits so attached in his hand or these hands ought not to be condemned according to Law.  
if he him her or them I shall soon meet and how you shall Counte this writ that you make  
known unto our said Justice at the day & place aforesaid And have you then & there this writ without  
William Pearce your Deputie Justice of our said Court his day of the fiftenth day of the month of August  
1744 BOWNE your Justice

At Which said Court in this third day of August in the year of the day of Return of  
said Writ came William Duffie Justice of said County and made return thereof in these  
words thereon Endeavour as followeth viz. Kent County ss. By virtue of y<sup>e</sup> within writ to me  
directed to the Justice within mentioned I came that I have attached in y<sup>e</sup> hands of a Certain Samuel Thomas  
of said County the sum of forty Shillings Sterl. money as the rights & Credits of y<sup>e</sup> within mentioned  
Robert Dunchley to satisfy to y<sup>e</sup> within mentioned James Smith in part of the within Judgment to himselfe  
made known unto by said Samuel Thomas that he be and appear at the time and place within mentioned  
to shew cause if any he have or why y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid forty Shillings should not be condemned according to  
Law before Charles Myner & William Jones good Lawfull men of my Baylyrick &c. And also y<sup>e</sup> Do  
Certifie to y<sup>e</sup> same Justice within mentioned that I have attached in the hands of a Certain Dominick  
Kenslagh of said County the sum of Seventeen Shillings Sterling money as of Rights & Credits of  
y<sup>e</sup> within mentioned Robert Dunchley to satisfy to y<sup>e</sup> within mentioned James Smith in part of  
y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Judgment and have also made known unto the said Dominick Kenslagh that he be and  
appear at y<sup>e</sup> time and place aforesaid to shew cause if any he have or why y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Seventeen Shillings  
should not be condemned according to Law before James Duffie & William Blackston good Lawfull  
men of my Baylyrick &c. as the within writ Counteth & requireth p<sup>er</sup> W<sup>m</sup> H<sup>er</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> 1744 Ther  
and now here at the said Court viz. the same day last mentioned Cometh the said  
James Smith by Thomas Borne his Attorney and prays the Court here that he may have judgment  
for condemnation of the aforesaid forty Shillings Sterl. in the hands of Samuel Thomas and Seventeen  
Shillings
