**COMMANDED** it was to the Sheriff of Kent County that  
the second day of June in the thirteenth year of the reign of  
her most Majestie Anne & that he take Peter Massey late of K.  
County planter if he should be found in his Bayle with him safe  
keeps so that he have his body before her said Majesties Justice of the said Court now  
held at of Court house in the town of Chester in said County in Court judicially sitting  
immediately to answer unto John Haddon of the said County of a plea of trespass  
upon of Case and that he have them and there the said writ etc.

At which said Court came William Frisby Gent High Sheriff of said County  
and made return of said writ in these words Haddon endorsed as follow viz. Capitulum  
of W<sup>m</sup> Frisbysher

At which said Court the said Deft being called came and the said p<sup>t</sup> by  
Thomas Bowne his atty prayed that the said Deft might give Special Bayle to the  
above Action which was granted and that the Sheriff of said County was to keep  
in safe Custody until he should give Bayle as afo

After which John Carke of said County in Court came and did acknowledge  
himself as Special Bayle to the said Action and doth undertake for the said Deft  
of payment of the Damages and Cost if it should happen that the said John Haddon  
should obtaine Judgment against the said Peter Massey in the said Action of Trespass  
upon the Case and the said Peter the Condemnation should not satisfy nor give  
his life to the Custody of the Sheriff of said County deliver or that the said John Carke  
the body of the said Peter Massey should not render etc.

After which the said Deft by Francis Coke his attorney appeared to the  
above Action and prayed Liberty thereof to inquire thereto and to answer at next  
Court which was granted the same day was given the p<sup>t</sup> also.

At which said next Court viz. the third day of August in the year of the  
said Cause was by this Court continued until next Court in Course etc.

At which said next Court viz. the fourth day of November in the year afo.  
the said Cause standing for trial came the said p<sup>t</sup> by Thomas Bowne his atty &  
the said Deft by Francis Coke his atty and the said p<sup>t</sup> by his atty  
filed his Declaration with the Clerk of this Court But afterwards comes into  
Court the said p<sup>t</sup> by his said atty and prays that he may pay Cost to the  
Deft
