The said George Quaine is by this Court here Discharged Robert Meeks at the same time as an Oath on the behalfe of his Majesty against the said John Jones Jun^r being into Oath for his ap^{pe} at this Court and now the said Robert Meeks in his proper person Comes into Court & appears to the said George Quaine . . . ordered by the Court here that the said Robert George Quaine be Discharged etc.

Robert Meeks George Quaine taken in the Summe of five pounds Sterl before of the said Capt William Pitt for his appearance to this present Court as an Evidence on his Majesty's behalfe against the said John Jones Jun^r. The said George Quaine is by this Court here Discharged etc.

The Queen . . . George Quaine taken of Capt Court for his appearance etc. to this Court . . . The said Darby Whaland in his proper person Comes into Court and appears to the said George Quaine. Ordered by the Court here that the said George Quaine and his Surety George Darby Whaland for his appearance be Discharged

Darby Whaland of his George Quaine being taken in y^e Summe of Twenty pounds Sterl etc. of Capt Court for his appearance to this present Court and that in the mean time he was to be of good behav^{our} to all her Majesty's Liege people and especially to Philip Howard of said County March. and not to frequent the Dwelling plantation of the said Philip and to enforce into all such things as should be objected against him on her Majesty's behalfe etc. This Court here Discharges the said George Quaine etc. Likewise John Hadding and Laughlin Flinn each Dubed into George Quaine in y^e Summe of four pounds Sterl each etc. for the appearance of the said Darby Whaland at this Court etc. and to be of good behav^{our} as afo^{re} etc. The said George Quaine each of them are by this Court Discharged etc.

Mr Carke of this Court saith that the said Darby Whaland is indebted to him the Summe of four hundred and fifty eight pounds of Tobacco fees according to his severall recognizance and Discharges on y^e same recognizance and severall Evidence Comed against him etc. and pray this Court here that he may have Surety for the same. After which Comes into Court and John Hadding of this County and saith that he will pay unto the said James Smith his honor's Ex^{or} Administrators the Summe of four hundred and fifty eight pounds of Tobacco for the said Darby Whaland all which the said James Smith Discharges the said Darby from the same Summe of Tobacco etc.
