William Frisby Esq. High Sheriff of said County take the said Elizabeth Jones into his Custody  
Carry her to the publique Whipping post & to have her on her knees back stry-  
mde Lashes on her bare back till the blood runneth and when the same is ended  
Bring her into Court againe &c.

At which said next Court by the same day Esq. mentioned came the said Sheriff  
and made returne of the process with the body of the said Elizabeth and the  
said process was endorsed as followeth In all things served and executed  
W<sup>m</sup> Frisby Sheriff.

It is ordered by this Court here that the Clarke of this Court make out  
Warrants to the Constables of the Hundreds where those persons live that there  
is Judgments against and also to issue out Summons for the severall Evidence  
put on the two Bills against Mary Freebourn and Katharine Kelley to be  
Returnable to the next Court

Charles Hynson as an Evidence to a power of Attorney from Madam Elizabeth  
Harris to her husband Cap<sup>t</sup> James Harris to Convey Land in said County to  
Vanbobbler of said County. And the said Charles Hynson takes his Corporall Oath on  
the Holy Evangelist of Almighty God and saith that he did see the said Mad<sup>m</sup> Harris  
Signe Seal and Deliver the same power of Atty to and for the use thereof  
Contained and he likewise saith that he did see said William Wood land as an Evid<sup>e</sup>  
to of same power of Atty Signe at the same time. (The same power of Atty  
Bears date of thirtieth day of October last)

John Wilfere of this County comes into Court and saith that he being formerly  
a Servant to Cap<sup>t</sup> Edward Pleasants of this County and that the said Edward Pleasants  
him free and he is not Capable of getting his Cudly head on which he shewes to  
this Court his Condition of a very great sore on his left Arm which he says he gotten  
the said Pleasants Service. On which this Court thinks fitt & orders that the  
Clarke of this Court make out an ord. to the said Pleasants that he the said Pleasants  
to take care of the said John Wilfere to next Court and then the said Pleasants appear  
at Court to make of Court Sincere of the truth in of Pleasants as the Court may thin do  
as to Justice opportunis to both parties. The same ord. made out and delivered  
to the said John Wilfere immediately &c.
