Daorn being called came and in his proper person appears to the same and prays that he may be discharged from the said recognizance ordered by this Court here that the same recognizance be discharged as also his Surety recognizance for his appearance

James Daorn of his recognizance taken in the sum of Ten pounds Sterling to be levied etc. in case he did not make his personall appearance at this Court and to answer unto all such matters and things as shall be objected against him by a Certifying Janet Gibbin who on the twenty first day of March last before the said Mr. William Pitt charged him upon Oath that she was then with Child by him the said James which when she shall be delivered will be a safe Child etc. The said recognizance is by this Court here discharged

Edmond Pearce at the same time last mentioned before the said Mr. William Pitt entered into recognizance for the appearance of the said James Daorn in the sum of five pounds Sterling to be levied etc. and that the said James was to answer unto what shall be objected against him in behalf of the said Janet Gibbin as above. The said recognizance is by this Court here discharged

Ordered by the Court here that the said James Daorn give new Surety and enter into recognizance for his appearance to next Court to answer unto what shall be said to his charge on account of his committing fornication with the said Janet Gibbin as by his Oath above taken before the said Mr. William Pitt

On which the said James Daorn comes into Court and acknowledged himselfe indebted to his Majesty King George in the sum of Ten pounds Sterling to be levied on his good and Chattells Lands and Tenements conditionally that if the said James doth not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County and there to answer unto what shall be objected against him in behalfe of the said Janet Gibbin charging him on her Oath that she hath begot him with Child which when she shall be delivered will be a safe born Child. to which the said James acknowledged himselfe therewith Content

Otherwise came into Court Mr. William Pitt and Mr. Edmond Pearce and acknowledged themselves indebted to his Majesty King George his heirs and assigns in the full and just sum of five pounds Sterling each to be levied on their severall goods and Chattells. Lands and Tenements conditionally that if the said James Daorn doth not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County to answer as above whosoever they acknowledge themselves therewith Content
