And the said Rachel being called came and in her proper person appeared
to the said Indictment. And the same being read and the said Rachel being asked
whether she is Guilty or not Guilty as above to which she said that she
is Guilty of the premises and submits herself wholly to the determina-
tion of this Court.

Ordered by this Court here that the said Rachel give
the Begitter of the Case here. And she bore of her body but says to do
the same. Therefore it is considered by this Court here viz. this 10th day
of April Anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and Eighteen that the
said Rachel Duties have musteen Cashes well Laid on her bare back
the blood appear according to the Discretion of the Court etc. And also pay the
sum of four hundred forty nine pounds of Tobacco Cash according on the
promises to the officers of this Court.

It is likewise considered by the Court here viz. the same day Cash mentioned
that William Frisby Gent high Sheriff of said County take the said Rachel Duties
to the whipping post and there to strip her and to receive on her bare back as in
the Judgment aforesaid and when executed to bring her into Court
after which the same day Cash mentioned came the said Sheriff and
made return of his process in those words hereon enlarged as follow^{ing} viz
In all things served and executed by W^m Frisby Sheriff.

Ordered by the Court here that the said Rachel give Surety to keep the
Child that was delivered of her body from any Charge that shall or may accrue to this
County
