His Majesty's Command was given to the Sheriff of Kent County the fourth day of June in the twelfth year of the said Queen Anne that he cause to come Elizabeth Meeks daughter of James and Elizabeth Meeks of South Paschas hundred in Kent County and Spouse of the Sheriff found in his Writ that all excuses and Delays be left a part she do and personally appear before her said Majesty's Justice of the then next Court to be held at the Court house in the Town of Chester in P County to Answer unto a Certain Bill of Judgment found against her by the Grand Jury for Committing Fornication with a Certain person to the Jury unknown And that he was to have then and there the said precept

And that he was to have then and there the said precept in the Year last mentioned the day of return of said precept and made return thereof in those words therein endorsed as fell viz. viz. J. Harris Sheriff. And the said Elizabeth Meeks being solemnly called came not nor any person in her behalfe

Command was likewise given to the Sheriff of Kent County the fifth day of August in the same year of her P late Majesty's Reign that he cause to come the said Elizabeth Meeks to Answer as afo. All w^{ch} said next Court viz. the third day of Novemb. the same Year last mentioned the day of return of the precept against the said Elizabeth. and made return thereof as fell viz.
