 the a<sup>d</sup> James in his life time viz on the Seventh day of 9<sup>ber</sup> Anno Dom<sup>o</sup>  
 Seventeen hundred & Twelve at Philadelphia in the parish of St. Paul  
 in Kent County a<sup>d</sup> within y<sup>e</sup> Jurisdiction of this Court stood Indebted unto  
 y<sup>e</sup> a<sup>d</sup> p<sup>ts</sup> the Sum of ten pounds four Shillings Sterling money for  
 goods & Merchandises to the said James before that time by y<sup>e</sup> p<sup>ts</sup>  
 sold & Delivered and being so Indebted as a<sup>d</sup> the said James in his  
 life time of y<sup>e</sup> Seventh day of 9<sup>ber</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> year Seventeen hundred &  
 twelve at Philadelphia in y<sup>e</sup> parish of St. Paul in Kent County  
 a<sup>d</sup> within y<sup>e</sup> Jurisdiction a<sup>d</sup> according to y<sup>e</sup> use and Customs of Exchange  
 amongst Merchants and others in the said County & Province always  
 hitherto used & allowed delivered to them the said p<sup>ts</sup> three severall  
 Bills of Exchange all of one Tenour and date bearing date Philadelphia  
 9<sup>ber</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> Seventh Anno Domini Seventeen hundred & Twelve a<sup>d</sup> w<sup>th</sup>  
 y<sup>e</sup> proper hand & in y<sup>e</sup> name of him the said James subscribed and to  
 a certain M<sup>r</sup> William Cordner in London directed requiring & appointing  
 him the said William Cordner by y<sup>e</sup> full of y<sup>e</sup> a<sup>d</sup> three Bills of Exchange  
 at twenty days sight of the same Bill his second or third Bills of y<sup>e</sup> same  
 Tenour a date not being paid to pay to y<sup>e</sup> said p<sup>ts</sup> by y<sup>e</sup> name of  
 Mess<sup>rs</sup> Joseph Rolfe & Thomas Norton or there order the Sum of ten  
 pounds four Shillings Sterling money for value received of them and pay
