Exchange of  $\text{£}$  James did require of  $\text{£}$  William Cordis at twenty  
days sight of  $\text{£}$  same Bill his first or third Bills of the same tenor &  
date not paid to pay to  $\text{£}$  said p<sup>ts</sup> or there order the sum of ten  
pounds four Shillings Sterling money for value received of them and place  
it to Account of James Crawford and by the third of  $\text{£}$  said three Bills  
of Exchange of said James did require of  $\text{£}$  William Cordis at twenty  
days sight of  $\text{£}$  same Bill his first or second Bills of  $\text{£}$  same tenor  
& date not paid to pay to the said p<sup>ts</sup> or their order of sum of ten  
pounds four Shillings Sterling money for value received of them and place  
it to Account of James Crawford All in Consideration of the promises  
he the said James on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of  $\text{Febr}$ . Anno Domini  
Seventeen hundred & Twelve in the life time of  $\text{£}$  said James at  
Philadelphia in the parish of St. Paul in Kent County and within the  
Jurisdiction of this Court upon himself assumed & by  $\text{£}$  said p<sup>ts</sup> then  
and there last said faithfully promised that if  $\text{£}$  said three Bills of  
Exchange or any one of them should for want of due acceptance or pay-  
ment thereof by  $\text{£}$  William Cordis according to  $\text{£}$  tenor & effect of  
 $\text{£}$  same Bills and Custom & Usage Amongst Merchants therein be pro-  
tested according to  $\text{£}$  Use & Customs of Merchants he the said James  
when thereunto required the sum of ten pounds & four Shillings  
Sterling Sterling money together with all such Cost damages & Interest  
which by  $\text{£}$  Laws of this Land and  $\text{£}$  Customs Amongst Merchants  
did or should arise or accrue to  $\text{£}$  said p<sup>ts</sup> or that of  $\text{£}$  said p<sup>ts</sup>.  
should suffer and sustain by cause or reason of such protest unto  $\text{£}$ .  
said p<sup>ts</sup>. would well and truly pay & Content and  $\text{£}$  said p<sup>ts</sup>. in deed  
say that afterwards viz. on the third day of February Anno Domini  
Seventeen hundred & Twelve at Lond<sup>n</sup> and did in  $\text{£}$  life time of  $\text{£}$ .  
said James of  $\text{£}$  said twenty days being & paid & pass they by James  
Dunidge Notary & Tabellion publick residing in London and
