Mrs. Isabella Blay Wid. of Mr. William Blay late dec. deliv. to this Court a certain Mary Lavender who was delivered off a Molato Child who was to serve the County Seven years for committing such an offense the Court orders that notice be given that any person that will pay the County the Sum of fifteen hundred pounds of Tobacco may have the said Mary for the Space of Seven years

Mr. William Glaswill comes into Court and assumes to pay the County fifteen hundred pounds of Tobacco next fall for the said Serv. woman for the time and Space of Seven years and at the Expiration to be delivered up to the Court again
