His Honor the Proprietor and the body of Kent County of upon John Jones there Oath do present that John Jones late of South Pasapatan upper hundred in the County of Pasapatan the first day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and fourteen at South Pasapatan upper hundred in the County of Pasapatan and within the Jurisdiction of this Court the Case of a certain Joseph Weidung by force and Arms did break and enter and two hogs of the value of Twenty Shillings current money of America the goods and Chattels of the said Joseph Weidung then and there being found feloniously did steal take and carry away against the peace of the said Lord Proprietor his rule & dignity and against the form of an Act of assembly of this Province in such Cases made and provided Johnson of the Proprietor
