William Tread of said County acknowledges an instrument of writing for two hundred acres of Land to Mary Pearce and her heirs

M^r Lamb Wilmer M^r Henry Lowe Jun^r and M^r John Marsh they take their places and sit on the bench

M^r Thomas Rowne having a Ser^o. John Underhill Jun^r whom the County had paid some Tob^o. the said M^r Thomas Rowne saith he hath proved his title with him and he delivers him up to the Court on which

John Underhill Sen^r comes into Court and assumes to pay the County the Tobacco ~~the~~ was paid for his Son being the sum of Six hundred eighty four pds of Tob^o

M^r Rasin comes into Court and brings a power of attorney from Philip Rasin and his wife to make over one hundred acres of Land being part of tract of Land called Drevit to William Reding - William Debruler and Nathl. Pearce being witnesses to the same proves that they see the ap^d Philip Rasin and his wife sign Seal and deliver the said power of atty to and for the uses therein contained

Thomas Rasin by vertue of the ap^d power of attorney comes into Court and acknowledges the conveyance for the ap^d ~~one~~ hundred acres of Land to William Reding his heirs and assigns forever

M^r Rasin comes into Court and brings a power of attorney from John Hamblin to make over one hundred acres of Land being part of two tracts of Land called Drevit and Pometon to Will^m Reding William Debruler and Nathaniel Pearce being witnesses to. The same proves that they see the ap^d John Hamblin sign Seal and deliver the said power of attorney to and for the uses therein contained

Thomas Rasin by vertue of the ap^d power of attorney from the ap^d John Hamblin comes into Court and acknowledges the conveyance for the ap^d one hundred acres of Land to William Reding his heirs and assigns forever
