Indulments & offereth himselfe against the app^{ee} Jane and she being called came and in her proper person appeared to the app^{ee} Judgment ordered by this Court here that the app^{ee} Jane prove the Begitter the same Jane takes her corporall oath on the holy Evangelists of Almighty God and saith that a certain James Doorn of this County was the person committed fornication with her and thereby did begett a Child on her body on which she Submitts herselfe on the same to this Court and prayes that the Court will be favourable to her Therefore it is Considered by the Court here by this nineteenth day of June Anno Dom^o 1716 That the app^{ee} Jane Gibbin be taken to the whipping post and to receive on her bare back twenty one lashes till the blood app^{ee} for Committing the offense of fornication app^{ee} and also pay of some of Three hundred and Seventeen pounds of Tobacco Collary on the premises app^{ee}

It is Considered by the Court here also that William Frisby Gentl High Sheriff of said County take the app^{ee} Jane Gibbin to the publique whipping post and to receive as in the Judgment app^{ee} and then to bring into Court againe

after w^{ch} the same day last mentioned came the app^{ee} Sheriff and made return of his said precept in all things served and executed w^{ch} Frisby then ordered by the Court here that the said Jane return to her Masters Service ordered by the Court here that the said Jane at the expiration of her time be delivered by her Mast^r to the Sher^{iff} or Court &c
