 That he take George Hill of Kent County Ship Carpenter and did George Hill of Kent County Ship Carpenter if  
 he shall be found in his presences and him safe keep so that he have  
 his body before his said Lord Ship Justice of the next Court to be held  
 at the Court house in the Town of Chester in said County to be answered  
 to answer unto William Frisby Gent Sheriff of the County of a plea that he  
 render to him the full and just sume & quantity of six thousand nine  
 hundred & eighty pounds of good sound Merchantable Leaf Tobacco every  
 way well qualified in Carg of y<sup>e</sup> value of Twenty nine pounds Sterling money  
 which he unjustly detains &c. And that he have then and there the said  
 writ &c. At which said next Court viz the twentieth day of November  
 in y<sup>e</sup> same year last mentioned the day of return of said writ came  
 William Inggold Gent one of y<sup>e</sup> Coroners of said County & made return  
 thereof in these words thereon. Endorsed as fo<sup>l</sup>ow<sup>ing</sup> viz. Epi Cipus J<sup>u</sup>g<sup>u</sup>l<sup>u</sup>m Inggold  
 Cro. And a doc being fild when said writ issued and a Copy thereof  
 served therewith according to Act of assembly in such cases made was as  
 fo<sup>l</sup>ow<sup>ing</sup> viz. Kent County to George Hill of Kent County Ship Carpenter a D<sup>o</sup>id.  
 George Hill of Kent County Ship Carpenter was summoned to answer unto  
 William Frisby Gent Sheriff of the County of a plea that he render to him the  
 full and just sume & quantity of six thousand nine hundred and eighty pounds  
 of good sound Merchantable Leaf Tobacco every way well qualified in Carg of y<sup>e</sup>

 firmly bounden unto the s<sup>ay</sup>d William by y<sup>e</sup> name of William Frisby
