ordered by the Court here that the aforesaid James Doorn pay the sum of five hundred pounds of Tobacco to the Master of the aforesaid Jane Gibbin for her disgrace and Expence in the time she was lying in

ordered by the Court here that the said James Doorn give Sureties to keep the County harmless from the aforesaid Child and all charges arising on the same

James Doorn aforesaid acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of five thousand pounds of Tobacco to be levied on his goods and Chattell Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not keepe the County from all charges that shall or may accrue on account of the Child aforesaid delivered of the aforesaid Jane Gibbin wherewith he saith he is content

John Bryant of this County comes into Court and acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of five thousand pounds of Tobacco to be levied on his goods and Chattell Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the aforesaid James Doorn shall not keepe the County from all charges that shall or may accrue on account of the Child aforesaid delivered of the aforesaid Jane Gibbin wherewith the said John Bryant saith he is content
