Said William when therunto required would well and truly pay & Content yet
the said Frances her promises and assumptions as in forme as made little
regarding but fraudulently intending the said William in that behalfe
to deceave the said two hogheads of Tobaco to the said William altho afterwards
by the tenth day of 9. Anno Domini Seventeen hundred & Sixteen
or soon after she was at the parish as in the County as in the Jurisdiction
as thereto required hath not paid repaid or made any Content for y^e same
but that the said two hogheads of Tobaco to pay or Content the said
Frances hitherto hath denied and yet deny to the Damages of the said
William the value of five pounds Sterling money and thereupon he bring
sute &c. *Benne of Tued* John Doe and Richard Roe

and the said Deft by John Roberts her attorney appeared to the above
anon and pleaded as fold by Her and the said Frances Crawford by
John Roberts her attorney comes and defends the force and Injury w^{ch}
&c. and for plea saith she did assume upon herself in such manner and
forme as the plt in his Deed above against her hath supposed and of this
she for herself puts her self upon the Country Roberts for Def.

and the plt in like manner. *Benne of Tued*

After which came into Court the said Deft by her attorney
and saith that she cannot gainay the action as of the said
plt. nor but that she is indebted the said Tob^o in the above
Deed mentioned containing five hundred pounds of Tobaco and is
willing that Judgment shall be entred for the same and Cost thereon
accruing. Therefore it is considered by the Court here by this
twenty third day of March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred &
Sixteen that the said plt William Ruggold do Recover against the
said Deft Frances Crawford as well the said sume of five hundred
pounds of Tobaco Damages as also the sume of four hundred
twenty one pounds of Tobaco Cost by the said plt about his suite in
this behalfe expended and by the Court here of his assent adjudged
and the said Deft in money &c.
