Justices of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of Shep  
in said County to answer unto Hugh Durborough of a plea of Trespas  
upon the Case and that he have then and there the said writ *videlicet*  
which said next Court viz The nineteenth day of March the same  
year last mentioned the day of return of said writ came William Frisby  
Gent High Sheriffe of said County and made return thereof in these words  
thereon endorsed as foell viz *Capit Corpus* *Wm Frisby Sh.*

all which said Court the said Deft being called came and the said  
plt by Thomas Bourne his atty and prayd the said Deft might give  
Special Baile to the above Action which was granted after which  
M<sup>r</sup> Michael Miller of said County in Court came and acknowledged him-  
self Special Baile in the above Action and did undertake for the said  
Deft the payment of the Damages and Cost if it should happen that the  
said plt should obtain Judgment against the said Deft in the said  
Action of Trespas upon the Case and the said Deft the Condemnation  
as should not satisfy nor himself to the Custody of the Sheriffe of  
said County deliver or that the said Michael Miller the Body of the said  
Thomas Hues should not render to.

after which the said Deft in his proper person appeared to the  
said Action and prayd liberty thereof to appear thereto and to  
answer at next Court which was granted the same day was given the  
plt also.

all which said next Court viz the Eighteenth day of June Anno  
Domini one Thousand Seven hundred and Seventeen the said *Capit*  
standing for tryall came the said plt by Thomas Bourne his atty  
and declared as foell viz Kent County s<sup>r</sup> Thomas Hues of Kent County  
Labourer was attached to answer unto Hugh Durborough of a plea  
of Trespas upon the Case and whereupon the afo<sup>r</sup> plt by Thomas  
Bourne his attorney saith that whereas the afo<sup>r</sup> Deft of nineteenth  
day of 7<sup>th</sup> mo Anno Domini seven teen hundred & thurteen at Dover
