of Kent County the Twenty Second day  
of August in the Second Year of his  
Majestie King George the Second Lord of Kent  
take Thomas Winn junr of Kent County  
planted if he shold be found in his Bailiwick and him safe  
keeps so that he have his body before his said Lordships Justies  
of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of  
Chester in said County to answer unto William Smith of a pleau  
of trespass upon the Case and that he have ther and there the  
said writ &c. At which said next Court viz. the nineteenth  
day of November the same year last mentioned the day of  
return of said writ came Thomas Wilmer Gentligh Thos.  
of said County and made return thereof in these words theron  
Endorsed as sold by Capt. C. Wilmer Thos. And a declaracion  
being filed when said writ issued forth and a copy whereof servd —  
therewith according to Act of Assembly in such case made whic  
was as sold by Thomas Wilmer Thos. Thomas Winn Junr of Kent  
County planted stands attached to answer unto William Smith  
of a pleau of trespass upon the Case. And whereupon the aforesd  
william by Thomas Bowe his attorney Complaineth for that whereas  
the aforesd william in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven  
hundred and seventeen and unlesst thy time was all St Pauls Parish in  
Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court an approved Inholder  
and Ordinary keeper and as such sold vended and delivered to diverse  
Inhabitants of this Province and other persons diverse liquors and found  
and provided to other suitable accommodations during whiche time of the  
williams keeping keeping an Inn or Ordinary viz. the nineteenth day of  
april in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and  
seventeen att St Pauls Parish in Kent County aforesd within the  
jurisdiction of this Court. In Consideration the said william att y<sup>e</sup> special  
instance and request of the said Thomas Winn had then and there last  
mentioned sold and delivered to y<sup>e</sup> Thomas Winn to the proper use and  
 behoove of the Thomas Winn diverse liquors and found and provided other  
suitable accommodations in an account hereunto annexed mentioned  
all the several rates and prices in the said account set forth in the whole  
amounting unto y<sup>e</sup> sum of nine hundred and thirty seven pounds of good  
merchantable Tobacco the same Thomas Winn upon himself assurid and  
to the said william then and there last mentioned faithfully promised  
that he the Thomas the aforesd nine hundred and thirty seven pounds  
of good merchantable Tobacco to the william when thereunto required  
would well and truly pay and content and that whereas also aforesd  
Thomas Winn afterwards viz. the aforesd nineteenth day of April in the year  
aforesd att the parish County and Jurisdiction aforesd. In Consideration
