William Smith Commanded it was to the Sheriff
 of Kent County the Twenty Second day
 of August in the Second Year of his
 Majesty's Dominion that he
 take Thomas Winn jun. of Kent County
 planter if he should be found in his Bailiwick and him safe
 keep so that he have his body before his said Lordships Justices
 of the next Court to be held at our Court house in the Town of
 Chester in said County to answer unto William Smith of a plea
 of Trespas upon the Case and that he have then and there the
 said writ &c.

At which said next Court viz. the nineteenth
 day of November the same Year last mentioned the day of
 return of said writ came Simon Wilmer Gent High Sheriff
 of said County and made return thereof in these words to wit
 Endorsed as folo viz. Capi Corpus Wilmer Sheriff. And a Declaraⁿ
 being filed when said writ issued forth and a Copy thereof served
 therewith according to Act of Assembly in such case made which
 was as folo viz. Kent County J^{ts}. Thomas Winn Jun. of Kent
 County planter stands attached to answer unto William Smith
 of a plea of Trespas upon the Case. And whereupon the afores^d
 William by Thomas Browne his Attorney complains for that whereas
 the afores^d William in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven
 hundred and seventeen and untill this time was all St Pauls Parish in
 Kent County within the Jurisdiction of this Court an approved Inholder
 and Ordinary keeper and as such sold vended and delivered to diverse
 Inhabitant of this Province and other persons diverse liquors and found
 and provided other suitable accommodations during which time of the
 said William keeping an Inn or Ordinary viz. the nineteenth day of
 Aprile in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and
 seventeen at St Pauls Parish in Kent County afores^d within the
 Jurisdiction of this Court In Consideration the said William all y^e special
 Instance and request of the said Thomas Winn had then and there last
 mentioned sold and delivered to y^e Thomas Winn to the proper use and
 behoofe of the said Thomas Winn diverse liquors and found and provided other
 suitable accommodations in an account hereunto annexed mentioned
 all the severall rates and prices in the said account set forth in the whole
 amounting unto y^e sum of nine hundred and thirty seven pounds of good
 Merchantable Tobacco the same Thomas Winn upon himself assumed and
 to the said William then and there last mentioned faithfully promised
 that he the said Thomas the afores^d nine hundred and thirty seven pounds
 of good Merchantable Tobacco to the said William when thereunto required
 would well and truly pay and Content And that whereas also y^e afores^d
 Thomas Winn afterwards viz. the afores^d nineteenth day of Aprile in the year
 afores^d at the parish County and Jurisdiction afores^d. In Consideration
