The Jurors for the Hon<sup>or</sup> Lord prop<sup>r</sup> of the body of Kent County on the oath do present that James Smith late of Shrewsbury Parish in the County afo<sup>r</sup> Labourer the first day of August in the Year of our Lord one and seven hundred and Seventeen at the parish County afo<sup>r</sup> & within the jurisdiction of this Court by force & armes a certain Charles Hill of the said County maliciously & feloniously did settle persuade & procure and in the house of a certain John Sue then and there feloniously to bear away the sume of thirty Shillings Current money of the goods & Chattels of the said John Sue and after the said felony committed the said sume of thirty Shillings did take and receive of the said Charles Hill against the peace of our Lord prop<sup>r</sup> his rule and
