also the Thirtie Shillings the gecey Stolen to the said John Lee as
also pay the several officers of this Court the sume of Two Thousand
and niney and nine pounds of Tobacco the Cost in the Judgment afo'
ordered by the Court here that the Clerk of this Court sett up notes
that the said James Smith is to be sold as a Servant to any person
that will pay the afo' sume of money amounting to Seven pounds
ten shillings Current money and the afo' sume of Two Thousand
and niney nine pounds of Tobacco

After which the same day last mentioned came W^m Simon Wilmer
of said County ^{and saith} that he would pay the afo' money and fee of the Court
would discharge of the said James Smith to him for Seven years or
which this Court here on the Consideration afo' that is to say that the said
Simon Wilmer obliges himself to pay unto John Lee afo' the sume of seven
pounds ten shillings Current money and also to pay the afo' two thousand
and niney nine pds of fee to the several officers of this Court to whom they
