 at which said Court viz. the Sunday last mentioned came Simon Wilmer
 High Sheriff of said County and made return of his said precept as followeth
 In all things served and executed by Wm. Miller the
 ordered by the Court here that the said James Smith go to his masters
 services againe at the Expiration to be delivered up to the Sheriff of
 Court but afterwards the said Francis Collins and the aforesaid servant James
 Smith came into Court and the said Francis Collins saith that he doth
 discharge the said James Smith from all manner of service bargain
 Debts Caus. and reckonings whatsoever to the day aforesaid and no other
 Sunday aforesaid afterwards came the said James Smith and saith that
 he discharge his said Master from all manner of bargain Contracts or
 any other matter or thing whatsoever from the beginning of the world to
 the day aforesaid last mentioned AND now the said Court **ORDERS** that
 the Sheriff said County keep the said James Smith in safe Custody until
 the said James Smith shall pay the four fold in the Judgment aforesaid
 also the Thirty Shillings the good Stobs to the said John Doe as
 also pay the severall officers of this Court the sume of Two thousand
 and ninety and nine pences of Tobacco the Cell in the Judgment aforesaid
 ordered by the Court here that the Clerk of this Court sett up notes
 that the said James Smith is to be sold as a servant to any person
 that will pay the aforesaid sume of money amounting to Seven pounds
 ten Shillings Currant money and the aforesaid sume of Two thousand
 and ninety ^{and} pences of Tobacco

After which the same day last mentioned came W. Simon Wilmer
 of said County ^{and saith} that he would pay the aforesaid money and Tob of the Court
 would dispose of the said James Smith to him for seven years or
 which this Court here on the Consideration aforesaid that is to say that the said
 Simon Wilmer obliges himselfe to pay unto John Doe aforesaid the sume of seven
 pounds ten Shillings Currant money and also to pay the aforesaid two thousand
 and ninety nine pces of Tob to the severall officers of this Court to whom they
 are due AND now this Court obliges the said James Smith to serve the
 said Simon Wilmer for and during the space of seven years to be fully
 completed and ended from any day of the date hereoff. according to all of
 assembly in such case made &c
