County Court to be had at our Court house in the Town of Chester in Said County on the third Tuesday in March next then and there to be Condemned according to Act of Assembly to and for the use of a Certain William Frisby in a plea that he render to him the full and just Summe of Nine pounds five Shillings Currant money of this Province which to him he owes and from him he unjustly detains &c. According to Law and that by good and Lawfull men of your Bailiwicks you make known unto the person or persons in whose hands you make the Same attachment that he she or they be and appear before the Justices of our Said Court to be had as aforesaid to show cause if any he she or they have why the Same Goods Chattells rights or Credits so attached in his her or there hands ought not to be Condemned according to Law if to him her or them it shall seem meet and how you shall Execute this writ that you make known unto our Said Justices at the day & place aforesaid and there this writt Witness My hande

High Sheriff of Said County and made return thereof in these words thereon endorsed as foreshown by my virtue of the within writ to me directed I Certifie to the Justices within mentioned that I have attached of the Goods and Chattells & Credits of the within named John Moore the Summe of Twelve hundred pounds of Merchantable Tobacco of the value of Twelve pound Sterling money in the hands of George Sanders and have the Same here ready to be Condemned according to Law to the use of the within named William Frisby and have made known to the said George Sanders before Michael Hackett and Samuel Bostwick Good and Lawfull men of my Bailiwick that he be and appear at the time and place within mentioned to show cause if any he have why Condemnation of the Same should not be Condemned according to Law as the within writt executeth and requirith
