Chief Justice of our said Court this Twentieth day of November in the
 second year of our Dominion, &c. Anno Domini 1717 *James Smith*
 At which said next Court viz. the eighteenth day of March the same year last
 mentioned the day of return of said writ came Simon Wilmer Esq. High Sher-
 of said County and made return thereof in these words thereon endorsed
 as follows: These are to certify to the Justices within mentioned that by virtue
 of the within writ to me directed I have made known unto the within
 named Robert Maxwell that he do and appear at the time and place
 within mentioned to show cause if any he has why Execution should
 not issue forth against him for the Damages and Cost in the Judgment
 within mentioned obtained against him by the within named
 Thomas Taylor before Abraham Ambrose and John Inch good Esq.
 Lawfull men of my said County &c. And so the words *J. Wilmer Sher.*

And now at this Court came the aforesaid by his atty aforesaid and prayed
 that Judgment on the said writs do may be entered if no cause shown
 to the contrary And no person coming in to show cause why Execution
 should not issue on the same by which the said might still remain
 undefended: Therefore it is considered by the Court here viz. this
 Twentieth day of March Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred
 and Seventeen that for the aforesaid sum of four hundred Ninety four
 pounds of Tobacco Damages aforesaid as also the sum of Three hundred
 and three pounds of Tobacco Cost aforesaid mentioned which in the whole
 amount unto the sum of seven hundred Ninety seven pounds of
 Tobacco And that the said ptt. Thomas Taylor have thereof Execution
 against the aforesaid Robert Maxwell as also for the sum of three
 hundred and twenty two pounds of Tobacco Cost by the aforesaid expended
 on the aforesaid writ of Scire facias and by the Court here of his assent adjudged
 &c.
