grand Jury for Stealing the Goods of a certain Shipper Ryer and that in the mean time she was to be of good behaviour And now at this Court as the same was continued from last Court to this Court and at this Court no person showing any cause why the said recognizance should not be discharged the Court here discharged the same James Brewer at last March Court as aforesaid entered into recognizance in the sum of ten pounds Sterling to be levied as aforesaid for the appearance of the said Venor Kendall & she to answer as aforesaid in the mean time she was to be of good behaviour The same was continued as aforesaid from last June Court to this Court and now at this Court the same recognizance is by this Court here discharged and ordered by the Court here that the said Venor Kendall enter into recognizance for her appearance to the next Court to answer unto a certain presentment found by the Grand Jury for Stealing the goods of a certain Philip Ryer.

The said Venor Kendall comes into Court and acknowledges herself indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the full and just sum of ten pounds Sterling to be levied on her goods and Chattels and Tenements conditionally that if she do not make her personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County to answer unto a certain presentment found against ^{her} for Stealing the goods of a certain Philip Ryer and that in the mean time she was to be of good behaviour — whereunto the said Venor acknowledges herself to be content.

His Lordship The said John Jones is ordered to enter into recognizance for his appearance to next Court.

John Jones John Jones as Comer into Court and acknowledges himself indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be levied on his goods and Chattels and Tenements conditionally that if he do not make his personall appearance at the next Court to answer unto what shall be objected against him in his Lordship's behalf — and in the mean time to be of good behaviour whereunto he acknowledges himself to be content.

George Sanders & John Mackoy Both of this County comes into Court & acknowledges themselves indebted to his Lordship his heirs and Successors in the sum of ten pounds Sterling each to be levied on their goods & Chattels and Tenements conditionally that if the said John Jones shall not make his personall appearance at the next Court to answer as aforesaid
