 thereof to impaire thereto and to answer at next Court which is granted y<sup>e</sup> same day  
 given the ptt. also

Commanded it was to the Sheriff of Kent County  
 the Twentys third day of November in the Second  
 Year of his Lord. M<sup>ty</sup> Dominion &c. That he take  
 Sarah Jewers of Kent County Widow of the Should be  
 found in his Bailiwick and cum safe keep so that he have his body before  
 the said Lord M<sup>ty</sup> Justice of the next Court to be held at our Court house in  
 the Town of Chertsey in said County to answer unto the Right Honourable  
 y<sup>e</sup> Lord Proprietor of this Province and James Harris who as well for the  
 said Lord Proprietor as for himselfe followeth of a plea that she render to the said  
 Lord Proprietor and the same James Harris the Summe of Two thousand pounds  
 of Merchentable Tobacco of the value of Twenty pounds Sterling money -  
 which to the said Lord Proprietor and the same James Harris she unjustly  
 detains &c. And that he have then and there the said writ of Praig liberty  
 said next Court viz. the Eighteenth day of March the same Year last  
 mentioned the day of return of said writ Came Simon Wilmor Gent. Sheriff
