 June Court 1716
COMMANDED it was to the Sheriff of Kent County the
 twenty fourth day of March in the first year of his Lordships
 Dominion that he take Thomas Cook of Kent County
 planter all did Tho Cook planter of Kent County in y^e province
 of Georgia if he should be found in his Baywick & him safe keep so that he have his body
 before his said Lordships Justices of the next Court to be held at our Court house in
 the Town of Chester in said County to answer unto Alexander Williamson Clerk
 principal Vestry man and his brethren Vestry men of St. Pauls parish in Kent County
 of a plea that he render to them the full and just sum of one Thousand two hundred
 pounds of good Merchantable leaf Tobacco in Cash to Contentie the same of the value
 of five pounds Sterling money of Great Brittain which from them he unjustly
 detains &c. And that he have them and there the said writ &c.
 At what said next Court viz this nineteenth day of June Anno Domini One
 Thousand seven hundred and sixteen the day of return of said writ came Will^m
 Frisby Gent High Sheriff of said County and made return thereof in these
 words thereon endorsed as follo viz. Copi Corpus y^e m^o Frisby Sheriff
 And the said Deft being called came and the app^r by Thomas Towns
 their atty and prayd that the said Deft might give special baile to the above
 action which was granted and that he be kept in safe Custody by the Sheriff
 of said County until he shall give special baile. ^{which came Thom.}
 Tolley of said County into Court and acknowledged himself special baile to the
 above action and undertakes the payment of the Debt up and Cost thereon
 arising if it shall happen that the said Deft should obtain Judgment against
 the said Deft in the said action of Debt and the said Deft the Condemnation
 shall not satisfy nor himselfe to the Custody of the Sheriff of said County
 or that the app^r Thomas Tolley the body of the said Deft shall not render &c.
 After which the app^r Deft in his proper person appeared to the above action
 and prayd Liberty thereof to imparce thereto and to ans^r at next Court which
 was granted the same day was given the p^rts also —

 Sterling money which to him he oweth and from him unjustly detaineth &c.
