 The said p^r by his atty prays that he may put in Security to the above
 action that if the Deft should appear and plead and the p^r should be Est in
 the same on which M^r Thomas Bourne comes into Court and acknowledges himself
 Security for the said p^r in the above action and saith that if the p^r should
 in the same that the Deft Est he will pay if the p^r do not
 A Declaration being filed in the said action and a Copy thereof served with the
 writ according to Act of Assembly in such Cases made was as follows Viz. That
 Thomas Taylor of Kent County Esqy and Sir Thomas Taylor of Kent County Esqy
 was summoned to answer unto Richard Bennett of a plea that he render to him the
 full & just sume of one thousand sixty six pounds of good sound Merchantable leaf
 Tobacco & Cash of y^e value of eighty eight Shillings & ten pence Sterling money
 which he unjustly detains and four Shillings six pence Sterling money which
 to him he doth & from him unjustly detaineth &c. And whereupon y^e said
 Richard by Thomas Bourne his atty saith that whereas y^e said Thomas Taylor the
 twentieth day of March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and Six at St Pauls
 parish in Kent County a^d within the Jurisdiction of this Court by his Certain Bill
 obligatory which the said Thomas Taylor sealed with his Seale & was his doct deliv^r
 here into Court brought the date whereof is the same day and year a^d bound himself
 to pay or cause to be paid unto y^e said Richard and a Certain Thomas Inggold Esqy
 of this King or either of them which said Thomas Inggold is now dead whom
 the said Richard served, the said full & just sume of one thousand sixty six pounds
 of Tobacco qualified as a^d in Cash of the said value of eighty eight Shillings
 & ten pence Sterling money & the said four Shillings six pence Sterling money
 on or before the first day of April next ensuing
 the date of the said Bill yet the said Thomas Taylor altho' often required the said
 one thousand sixty six pounds of Tobacco & the said four Shillings & six pence to
 the said Richard & Thomas Inggold or to either of them in the life of the said
 Thomas Inggold or to the said Richard after the death of the said Thomas Inggold
 whom the said Richard served hath not rendered or caused to be rendered but
 that to them to render he hath altogether denied and the same to the said Inggold
 hitherto hath denied and doth deny and the Tobacco a^d doth unjustly detain
 & whereupon the said Richard saith he is dammified one hundred & fifty six Shillings
 Sterling money & thereupon he brings Suite &c. *Richard Bennett*
