John Jones app<sup>r</sup> comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe indebted to his Lordship his heires and Successors in the full and just Summe of Twenty pounds Sterling to be Levoyd on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not make his personall appearance at the next Court to answer unto a Certain bill of Indictment found against him for Stealing hogs and in y<sup>e</sup> mean while to be of good Behaviour wherewith he acknowledges himselfe Content

Likewise John Peters and Roger Hix both of this County comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe indebted to his Lordship his heires and Successors in the full and just Summe of ten pounds Sterling each to be Levoyd on their goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if the app<sup>r</sup> John Jones doth not make his personall appearance at the next City Court to ans<sup>r</sup> as app<sup>r</sup> and in y<sup>e</sup> mean while to be of good Behaviour wherewith they acknowledge themselves Content

Ordered by the Court here that Joseph Wheeldon Enter into Recogn<sup>s</sup> as prosecutor ag<sup>t</sup> the app<sup>r</sup> John Jones. Joseph Wheeldon app<sup>r</sup> comes into Court and acknowledges himselfe indebted to his Lordship his heires and Successors in y<sup>e</sup> full and just Summe of Twenty pounds Sterling to be Levoyd on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if he do not app<sup>r</sup> at the next C<sup>t</sup> to be held for Id City to prosecute on his Lordships behalf ag<sup>t</sup> y<sup>e</sup> app<sup>r</sup> John Jones wherewith he saith he is Content

Ordered by y<sup>e</sup> Court here that Edward Williams as an Lord ag<sup>t</sup> the app<sup>r</sup> John Jones out<sup>d</sup> into Recogn<sup>s</sup>. Edward Williams app<sup>r</sup> comes into C<sup>t</sup> and acknowledges himselfe indebted to his Lordship his heires and Successors in y<sup>e</sup> Summe of five pounds Sterd to be Levoyd on his goods and Chattells Lands and Tenements Conditionally that if do not make his appearance at y<sup>e</sup> next Court as an Evidence on his Lordships behalf ag<sup>t</sup> y<sup>e</sup> app<sup>r</sup> John Jones wherewith he saith he is Content.

Chr Bateman having a pretence to a Certain Elizabeth Dolly app<sup>r</sup> Laug Plumie pretends to have a right to her the said Laug in C<sup>t</sup> takes his Corporall Oath &c. and saith that when the app<sup>r</sup> Elizabeth was at Chester Town soon after she was hired to M<sup>r</sup> John Moll he hired her on which this Court adjudges she doth not belong to the app<sup>r</sup> Christopher and that she be cleared from any pretence he alleges to her as a Serv<sup>t</sup>.
