

- (2) Improving job skills.
- (3) Attending trade licensing examinations.
- (4) Being interviewed for employment.
- (5) Participating as a volunteer for a governmental agency in an activity serving the general public.
- (6) Participating in athletic competition.
- (7) Participating in civic activities beneficial to the inmate and/or the community.

(b) The warden of the Baltimore City jail has the same leave authority with respect to inmates of the Baltimore City jail that the Commissioner of Correction has under this section with respect to inmates under the jurisdiction of the Department of Correction, and the provisions of this section apply to special programs or activities leave for inmates of the jail, except that "warden" means deputy warden in relation to the jail. Reference to the Department of Correction in this section means the Baltimore City jail in relation to the jail.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.

CHAPTER 303

(Senate Bill 188)

AN ACT concerning

Medical Care Programs - Automatic Assignment of Benefits

FOR the purpose of adding as a condition of eligibility for the Medical Assistance Program the automatic assignment of any rights to support for the purpose of medical care as determined by a court or administrative order and any rights to payment for medical care from any-third-party health insurance; and providing that the assignment shall be to the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene or the Secretary's designee.
