- [(2)] (E) The records shall be kept for 3 years after the transaction to which it applies.
- [(3)] (F) During business hours, the records of the licensee shall be open to inspection by the Administration or any police officer while discharging his official duties.

## 15-106.

- (a) If, during any license year, there is any change in the information that a licensee gave the Administration in obtaining [or retaining] a license under this title, the licensee shall report the change to the Administration within 30 days after the change occurs.
- (B) IF, DURING ANY LICENSE YEAR, THERE IS ANY CHANGE IN THE INFORMATION THAT A LICENSEE GAVE THE ADMINISTRATION IN RETAINING A LICENSE UNDER THIS TITLE, THE LICENSEE SHALL REPORT THE CHANGE TO THE ADMINISTRATION WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE CHANGE OCCURS.
- [(b)] (C) The report UNDER THIS SECTION shall be made on the form that the Administration requires.
- (D) The licensee shall sign the form and certify that the information given in it is true.

## 15-111.

- (A) If the Administration suspends [or revokes] the license of any person licensed under this title, the licensee immediately shall return the license to the Administration.
- (B) IF THE ADMINISTRATION REVOKES THE LICENSE OF ANY PERSON LICENSED UNDER THIS TITLE, THE LICENSEE IMMEDIATELY SHALL RETURN THE LICENSE TO THE ADMINISTRATION.

## 15-112.

- (a) In this section, "minibike":
  - (1) Means a motor vehicle that:
    - (i) Has a saddle for the use of the rider;
- (ii) Is designed to travel on not more than three wheels in contact with the ground; and
- (iii) Is not subject to registration under Title 13 of this article; and
  - (2) Does not include a farm tractor.
- (b) Any dealer or agent or employee of a dealer, any vehicle salesman, or any other person who sells a minibike shall inform the buyer[:
