21-1003.

(a) The provisions of this section apply except as necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic control device.

(b) A person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle[;]:

(1) In] IN front of a public driveway[;].

[(2) On] (C) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON a sidewalk[;].

[(3) In] (D) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE IN an intersection[;].

[(4) On] (E) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON a crosswalk[;].

[(5) Between] (F) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE BETWEEN a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless the State Highway Administration or local authority indicates a different length by signs or markings[;].

[(6) Alongside] (G) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ALONGSIDE or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction if to do so would obstruct traffic[;].

[(7) On] (H) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON any bridge or other elevated structure on a highway[;].

[(8) In] (I) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE IN a highway tunnel[;].

[(9) At] (J) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE AT any place where stopping is prohibited by an official sign[; or].

[(10) On] (K) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON any entrance or exit ramp of any highway with two or more lanes for traffic moving in the same direction.

[(c)] (L) A person may not stand or park a vehicle[;]:

(1) In] IN front of a private driveway without the consent of the owner or occupant of the premises[;].
