- (a) The provisions of this section apply except as necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or traffic control device.
 - (b) A person may not stop, stand, or park a vehicle[:
 - (1) In] IN front of a public driveway[;].
- [(2) On] (C) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON a sidewalk[;].
- [(3) In] (D) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A. VEHICLE IN an intersection[;].
- [(4) On] (E) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON a crosswalk[;].
- [(5) Between] (F) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE BETWEEN a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless the State Highway Administration or local authority indicates a different length by signs or markings[;].
- [(6) Alongside] (G) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ALONGSIDE or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction if to do so would obstruct traffic[;].
- [(7) On] (H) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON any bridge or other elevated structure on a highway[;].
- [(8) In] (I) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE IN a highway tunnel[;].
- [(9) At] (J) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE AT any place where stopping is prohibited by an official sign[; or].
- [(10) On] (K) A PERSON MAY NOT STOP, STAND, OR PARK A VEHICLE ON any entrance or exit ramp of any highway with two or more lanes for traffic moving in the same direction.
 - [(c)] (L) A person may not stand or park a vehicle[:
- (1) In] IN front of a private driveway without the consent of the owner or occupant of the premises[;].
