SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (a) After the conviction of an individual for a violation of Article 27, § 388 or § 388A of the Code, or of the vehicle laws or regulations of this State or of any local authority, points shall be assessed against the individual as follows:
- $\frac{(+9)}{-(+8)}$ $\frac{(7)}{-(+8)}$ ANY VIOLATION. EXCEPT VIOLATIONS COMMITTED ON THE JOHN F. KENNEDY MEMORIAL HIGHWAY. OF § 21-1411 OF THIS ARTICLE ... $-8-\frac{4}{-4}$ POINTS
- (a) Except as permitted by the rules and regulations of the Maryland Transportation Authority AND TO THE EXTENT PERMITTED BY FEDERAL LAW, a person may not transport OR KNOWINGLY CAUSE TO BE TRANSPORTED any of the following [dangerous articles] HAZARDOUS MATERIALS across or through any vehicular crossing or highway within the jurisdiction of the Maryland Transportation Authority:
 - (1) Combustible liquids;
 - (2) Compressed gases;
 - (3) Corrosive liquids;
 - (4) Explosives;
 - (5) Flammable liquids;
 - (6) Flammable solids;
 - (7) Oxidizing materials;
 - (8) Poisonous articles; or
 - (9) Radioactive materials.
- (B) THE PROVISIONS OF § 22-409 OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL APPLY TO THE TRANSPORTATION OF ANY PERMITTED HAZARDOUS MATERIAL ACROSS OR THROUGH ANY VEHICULAR CROSSING OR HIGHWAY WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF THE MARYLAND TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.
- [(b)] (C) To secure and preserve life and property, the Maryland Transportation Authority may adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of subsection (a) of this section.
