ADVERSE EFFECTS AND FUTURE TRENDS OF ACID DEPOSITION IN THE STATE:

- (4) RECOMMENDED STATE RESPONSES, WHEN APPROPRIATE, TO FEDERAL LEGISLATIVE OR REGULATORY INITIATIVES: AND
- (5) POTENTIAL OPTIONS TO EVALUATE ACID DEPOSITION AND ITS POTENTIAL ADVERSE EFFECTS IN THE STATE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 1986.

CHAPTER 608

(House Bill 214)

AN ACT concerning

Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency
Fund - Fee Schedule

FOR the purpose of altering the procedure by which fees are assessed to support the Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency Fund; requiring persons who transfer oil to obtain a license and pay a certain fee; altering the maximum limit of the Fund; altering the amount of fees that may be collected in any one year; altering certain penalties; requiring the Department of Natural Resources to provide certain legislative committees of the Maryland General Assembly with a certain report by a specified date each year; and generally relating to the Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency Fund.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article - Natural Resources Section 8-1411 Annotated Code of Maryland (1983 Replacement Volume and 1985 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
