CHAPTER 668

(Senate Bill 434)

AN ACT concerning

Domestic Violence - Warrantless Arrest

FOR the purpose of permitting a police officer under certain circumstances to arrest a person without a warrant if the officer has probable cause to believe the person criminally assaulted-or-caused-apparent-injury-to-certain-individuals with-whom-the-person-resides-or-formerly-resided;-providing law-enforcement-officers-making-certain-warrentless-arrests are-immune-from-civil-liability-under-certain-circumstances; battened the person's spouse; making technical changes; and generally relating to warrantless arrests in cases of alleged domestic violence.

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments Section 594B Annotated Code of Maryland (1982 Replacement Volume and 1985 Supplement)

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

594B.

- (a) A police officer may arrest without a warrant any person who commits, or attempts to commit, any felony or misdemeanor in the presence of, or within the view of, such officer.
- (b) A police officer [may, when he] WHO has probable cause to believe that a felony or misdemeanor is being committed in [his] THE OFFICER'S presence or within [his] THE OFFICER'S view, MAY arrest without a warrant any person whom [he] THE OFFICER may reasonably believe to have committed such offense.
- (c) A police officer may arrest a person without a warrant if [he] THE OFFICER has probable cause to believe that a felony
