- (2) An individual employed by the United States government as a dietitian OR NUTRITIONIST, while practicing within the scope of that employment;
- (3) An individual who aids in the practice of dietetics, if the individual works under the direct or indirect supervision of a licensed dietitian OR LICENSED NUTRITIONIST or licensed physician; AND
- (4) A registered dietitian who has recently become a resident of this State, or is a resident of this State but is not licensed, and who:
 - (i) Has applied for licensure; and
- (ii) Has not had a license application denied
 in this State[; and
- (5) A faculty member at an institution of higher education while teaching or conducting research related to the study of nutrition or dietetics].
- (c) Subject to regulations adopted by the Board, an individual may practice dietetics without a license if the individual:
- (1) Has met the academic and [clinical] EXPERIENCE requirements to be a licensed dietitian OR LICENSED NUTRITIONIST;
- (2) Has applied for or taken the licensing examination; and
- (3) Is awaiting notification of the examination results.

4.5-302.

- (a) To qualify for a license, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
 - (b) The applicant must be of good moral character.
 - (c) The applicant must be at least 18 years old.
 - (d) The applicant FOR LICENSURE AS A DIETITIAN shall:
- (1) (i) Have satisfactorily completed academic requirements for the field of dietetics as approved by the Board;
- (ii) Have received a baccalaureate degree or a higher degree from a college or university approved by the Board; and
- (iii) Have satisfactorily completed a program of supervised clinical experience approved by the Commission on
